Willow Class Curriculum Overview

Spring Term 2025

As readers and authors, we will be writing mystery stories based on the pictures in *The Mysteries of Harris Burdick*. We will also be reading and discussing *The Adventures of Odysseus* and writing a range of fiction and non-fiction texts based around the story.

As mathematicians, we will be continuing to develop our fluency, reasoning and problem solving skills in fractions, decimals, percentages, area and perimeter. Year 6 will also be having an introduction to algebra and ratio.

As creative artists, we will be exploring the use of light and colour in art. We will investigate the work of a variety of artists who work on installation artists before creating our own 2D and 3D pieces.

As scientific enquirers, we will plan and carry out a series of investigations to learn about changes of state in materials. We will think about changes which are reversible and non-reversible and how materials change when they react together.

As historians, we will be finding out about life in Ancient Greece. We will look at a range of evidence to find out about daily life in different city states, learn about how the Olympics and theatre influenced the Ancient Greeks and think about the legacy that the Ancient Greeks left.

As users of technology, we will be thinking about how data is collected and transmitted and how this can tell us about different locations. We will be learning to read binary code and carry out binary calculations.

In French, we are learning how to speak, listen, read and write about healthy and unhealthy foods and other activities we do to keep us healthy.

As theologians and philosophers, we will be asking questions about 'truth'. We will think about what truth means to us as well as people with different worldviews. We will also be deepening our knowledge about Salvation and important events in the Christian calendar around Easter.

As practical problem solvers, we will think about mechanical systems and design a pop-up book.

For our health and well-being, we will be thinking about the importance of keeping our self-identity while still having positive and healthy relationships with others. We will also be thinking about how our bodies and relationships change as we grow up.

As musicians, we will be continuing to learn the ukulele. We will also listen to and appraise music written by Carole King and learn to sing in a variety of styles including pop ballads and reggae.
